The member, or his/her parent/legal guardian, who has signed this form, shall indemnify the club and Skate Canada and hold them harmless from any claims, demands or actions arising from or in respect of such injury, loss or damage. *In the event of an injury or accident, and the Airdrie Skating Club is unable to contact the "contact persons" above, I/we give permission for the coaches to arrange for medical help. I/We agree to cover any and all expenses and costs related to the injury/accident.*

FOIP: In accordance with the Freedom of Information and Privacy Act, I give the Airdrie Skating Club permission to publish my child's name and/or photo on arena bulletin boards, trophies, carnival programs, newsletters, newspapers, website and any other areas pertaining to the "skating world".

Refund Policy: All group programs are entitled to three session trial period. If at the end of that trial period you wish to pull your child from the program, a refund less the \$31 Skate Canada Registration Fee and \$30 Administration Fee. In the event of any injury or accident the appropriate portion of the registration fee will be refunded if the request is accompanied by a doctor's certificate. No refund will be given if a student leaves by his/her own accord or is expelled by the Club. No refunds or make up sessions missed due to illness, holidays, competitions, tests, maintenance or management disputes.

Extreme Weather Policy: is set at a temperature of -35 w/wind chill ALL Ice Programs will be cancelled. No make-up sessions will be scheduled and NO refunds.

Pre-Hockey

Designed to help skaters develop balance, power & endurance
from basic skating skills already learned

- Must be 3 years as of October 1, 2008, 1 years skating experience and at coaches recommendation
- Child should be able to walk across ice and get up on their own
- Skaters will be allowed sticks (full equipment is optional)
- Small scrimmage at the end of some sessions
- All skaters must wear CSA approved hockey helmets

Sessions:

Mondays and/or Wednesdays 5:15-5:45 pm

Mondays and/or Wednesdays 6:15-6:45 pm

- All post dated cheques must be dated before Dec 1, 2008
- A \$30 fee will be charged on dishonored (NSF) cheques
- Airdrie Skating Club members have first choice of sessions until September 5, 2008
- Income Tax Receipts will be provided by February 28, 2009
- Parents can not participate on the ice unless asked to do so and are registered with Skate Canada
- **Any skater that has any special needs or health concerns must speak to the Coaches prior to the first day of skating. ASC wants to see to it that all skaters are successful.**

- All skaters must wear CSA approved hockey helmets
- Ski pants and nylon gloves are recommended

What to Expect the First Day of Skating:

- Please sign in at the registration table. You will then be shown to a dressing room.
- Please wait in the dressing room for your child's program assistant to get the group. The program assistants will bring the children back to the dressing room after the session. Due to congestion and safety issues we ask that you wait for your child in the dressing room.
- For Liability issues, you are not allowed to step onto the ice. For example, if you need to see your child or he/she needs to get to their group please call over a coach.
- The coaches will be assessing all the children closely during the first two weeks. Please be aware that your child may change groups, which means their assigned dressing room may change as well, so before each class check to see that your child is in the right dressing room with the right Program Assistant.
