Refund Policy: The applicant agrees to the following: 30 days written notice of termination of membership with the club must be supplied which includes skaters last days, at which point a refund less the \$31 Skate Canada Registration Fee and \$50 Administration Fee can be issued. If 30 days notice is not given, pro-rated days from the date of termination will be refunded less the Skate Canada Fee and Admin fee. All skating credits are non-refundable without appropriate skating related receipts. In the event of any injury or accident the appropriate portion of the registration fee will be refunded if the request is accompanied by a doctor's certificate. No refund will be given if a student leaves by his/her own accord or is expelled by the Club. No refunds or make up sessions missed due to illness, holidays, competitions, tests, maintenance or management disputes.

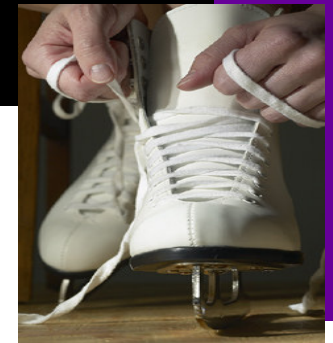

We are excited to have a program that is specifically designed to cultivate and develop skaters in a competitive environment. This program is for all competitive levels from pre-juvenile and beyond.

Skaters enrolled in CompetitiveSkate learn a variety of life skills as they progress up the competitive ladder. These include goal setting, focus, ability to deal with success/failure, time management and principles of fair play and sportsmanship.

Music:

To help assist the coaches on the ice, parents are required to help play the music. A music cheque is required at the beginning of the season which will be cashed. A music schedule will be completed and each parent is responsible for making sure their shifts are filled. Once all music shifts are completed money is returned or put in a club account for the skater.

- A \$30 fee will be charged on dishonored (NSF) cheques
- Airdrie Skating Club members have first choice of sessions until September 5, 2008
